PREAMBLE

WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a **SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC** and to secure to all its citizens:

JUSTICE, social, economic and political;

LIBERTY of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship;

EQUALITY of status and of opportunity; and to promote among them all

FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation;

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, do HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.

THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA

Chapter IV A

Fundamental Duties

ARTICLE 51A: Fundamental Duties - It shall be the duty of every citizen of India-

- (a) to abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem;
- (b) to cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom;
- (c) to uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India;
- (d) to defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so;
- (e) to promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women;
- (f) to value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture;
- (g) to protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers, wild life and to have compassion for living creature;
- (h) to develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform;
- (i) to safeguard public property and to abjure violence;
- (j) to strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement.
- (k) who is a parent or guardian to provide opportunities for education to his/her child or, as the case may be, ward between age of six and fourteen years.

Students must adhere to the school timings.

Students cannot leave early unless special permission is obtained from the proper authority and accompanied by at least one parent. Gate Pass will not be issued to attend social functions.

Students are expected to be punctual and regular to school.

Late comers shall not be given attendance for the forenoon session.

Parents are requested to collect the visiting pass at the security gate before entering the school and must get it acknowledged and submit it back to the security.

DRESS CODE

All students must come to school in proper uniform on all school days including birthdays, return of answer scripts days, PTM's. No other deviation in the school uniform will be allowed.

1) **Nursery and Pre- Primary:** No dress code for Nursery and Pre-Primary students. They should come to school in neat and ironed comfortable colour dress. Students to carry an extra pair of dress in their bag everyday.

2) Uniform for Boys: The Uniform shade is S - 26

Khaki shorts; khaki shirt (short sleeves with provision for shoulder tabs); shoulder tabs; plain khaki socks without design, black multipurpose shoes; and black belt with ordinary buckle. Students of Class VIII onwards shall wear khaki trousers. Low waist and slim fit/pencil cut trousers are not allowed. All boys must get a clean shave and haircut regularly. Avoid trendy hairstyles.

Games Uniform: T- shirt with school logo, house colour shorts, shoes and khaki socks without design, black multipurpose shoes. No other coloured shoes are allowed.

3) Uniform for Girls: The Uniform shade is S - 36

Olive green pinafore (to be worn an inch below the knees), cream coloured blouse with provision for shoulder tabs, shoulder tabs, olive green belt, black multipurpose shoes, white socks. (calf length is allowed, ankle and knee length not allowed). Girls must opt for simple, plain plaits or low ponytails using black ribbons only. Nails should be trimmed short at all times and unpainted. Jewellery and fancy clips are not permitted.

Games Uniform: White collar neck T- shirt with school logo, house colour shorts and divided skirts from Class V onwards, black multipurpose shoes, white socks. No other coloured shoes are allowed.

4) Note: Ankle and knee length socks are not allowed.

Navy blue V neck sweater is allowed during winters.

Jackets and hoodies are not allowed.

Games specific shoes are allowed during special coaching

Yoga classes: It is mandatory for girls to wear plain black colour leggings.

GROOMING

Girls: Fancy haircuts, make up, nail polish, long nails, tattoos, dangling earrings, multiple piercings and fancy hair clips and bands are not allowed.

Boys: Tattoos, long hair, fancy haircuts, colouring of hair or growing facial hair or any other accessories like chain, coloured threads, bands are not allowed.

Identity Card is part of the school uniform and it is compulsory for every student to wear it around the neck. Lost ID cards will not be replaced regardless of circumstances. Students are responsible for keeping their ID cards safe.

SCHOOL RULES

All the students of the school must read through the school rules carefully and follow them strictly. You will be helping the school in maintaining discipline if you obey these rules. Violation of any of these rules will lead to stringent action.

DRIVING IN SCHOOL: No student is allowed to drive any vehicle in the School premises at any time. Only bicycles are allowed and must be parked in the earmarked places.

BRINGING VALUABLES: Valuable articles, such as expensive pens, watches, flash drives, cameras, iPods, video-games, cell phones, smart phones, smart watches, fancy school bags, fancy shoes should not be brought to school. Carrying large amounts of money, other than what is required for bus/ auto fare etc, is not permitted. The school is not responsible for any kind of loss.

USING CELL PHONES: Students are not allowed to carry cell phones to the school. However, on a case to case basis, we may permit senior secondary students with proper written undertaking from the parents that students will not misuse the mobiles on the campus.

SCHOOL DECORUM: Students are expected to talk to each other politely both in class and outside the classroom. Use of abusive or foul language, hooting, shouting, whistling, cat calling, booing etc., is unbecoming of a public-school student. Students are expected to speak only in English in the school premises except during language periods. Students are allowed to visit the wash rooms only during the break time. They should not leave their classrooms in between the periods. Roaming in the corridors is not permitted.

SAFE GUARDING FURNITURE / FIXTURES: Damaging, misusing or fiddling the school property including the furniture, fans, smart boards and its equipments, wall clocks, washroom fittings etc. is a serious offence. Severe action will be taken against any such offence. The students also have to pay a fine five times the cost of the item damaged towards replacement/repairs as the case may be.

LEAVE POLICY: No leave is granted unless a proper leave letter / diary note for one or two days leave is submitted in advance. In case of sickness, a leave letter has to be brought when the student reports to school after availing sick leave not exceeding three days.

A medical certificate has to be produced in case of long sickness of more than three days and the same to be entered in the leave record page.

In case of an emergency, if a child is to be picked up from the school, parents will either have to come themselves or **send an authorised escort to take the child back home.**

Leave for family functions and vacations upto a week will be sanctioned only after taking due permission from the class teacher.

Leave upto 15 days will be sanctioned only after taking due permission from the Vice Principal.

Long leaves will not be appreciated unless there is an emergency. However in case of a genuine reason, leave for more than 15 days from school will be sanctioned only after taking due permission from the Principal.

If a student is absent for a month without getting leave sanctioned, his /her name will be struck off from the rolls.

Parents must inform the reason for the leave availed.

RETEST POLICY: Retest policy is purely the school's prerogative. It is conducted only for genuine reasons like the death of an immediate family member or when students represent the school at various competitions. (solely depends on the discretion of the Principal.)

ATTENDANCE POLICIES & PERMISSIONS: Every student should strive for 100% attendance. Students are expected to attend all classes. No student will be excused from attending any class unless it is a case of emergency or there is sufficient reason for which permission has to be obtained. Permission will be granted only on producing letters from the parents for the same. However, permission will not be given for social/religious functions/doctor's appointment (to be scheduled on a holiday). In such cases, the student may not attend school. Students must put in attendance of at least 75% for every quarter to be eligible to appear in the final examination. Shortage of attendence will have to be reported to CBSE as per their guidelines. However, the Principal has the discretion to reduce the minimum attendance requirement to 65% on medical/compassionate grounds and for children representing at national/ international level in sports.(as per CBSE guidelines). Students should not extend their holidays beyond the dates listed in the school calendar.

SICKNESS: Any case of sickness during school hours must be reported to the concerned teacher, hospital matron and the visiting doctor, if needed. He /She must get a written permission from the class teacher/ Associate teacher/subject teacher before visiting the dispensary.

EXCURSIONS AND CAMPS: Students are encouraged to participate in excursions, expeditions etc., arranged by the school. Students have to strictly obey the rules laid down by the school on such occasions.

The school takes adequate safety and precautionary measures. The staff is ever vigilant. In the event of an untoward incident that might occur due to the child's irresponsible or negligent behaviour, the school will not be held liable. If any student does not abide by the code of conduct, the school has full right to cancel his/her participation in school excursions/events.

BOUNDS: No student is allowed to use the school campus for any private purpose such as learning to drive a car, picnics, etc. Students are not permitted to stay in school longer than the school hours without permission.

DINING HALL: All students are expected to follow dining etiquette during lunch time. Students must remain at the dining table till the bell is rung. Talking during meal time and wasting food should be avoided.

SCHOOL LIBRARY:

The library has an open shelf system and students must maintain order and organisation.

Books may be left on the table after reading, not just anywhere on the shelves.

Books marked or damaged will have to be replaced or paid for by the borrower.

Students are allowed to borrow books against their own library cards.

Students should return the library book within 7 days from the date of issue, else a fine of Rs.5/- per book per day will be charged. If the students need to keep the book for more than 7 days, they can request for a renewal of the book, on the due date.

DISCIPLINE: The following disciplinary action will be taken if the student violates the school rules.

The school will issue Blue slips / Pink slips to bring the indiscipline on the part of the student to the parent's notice.

A Blue slip will be issued in case a student misbehaves / misuses school property or uses abusive language etc. (**Refer 'Discipline Code'**)

Three Blue slips will lead to the issue of one Pink slip. Three Pink slips will lead to suspension from the school for a minimum period of two weeks. **Refer discipline referral form.**

In case of very serious breaches, immediate suspension along with the issue of a pink slip will be implemented.

WITHDRAWAL OF THE CHILD: If the child attends the school even for a single day in an academic year, 1st instalment of fee has to be paid. If the child leaves the school after Term II(around September) of the academic year begins, entire year's fee will be collected.

In case a student is applying for a School Leaving Certificate, he/she must inform the school at least two weeks in advance.

Caution deposit must be collected back within 3 years of passing out from the school, otherwise the amount will be forfeited.

Defaulters, if any, will not be permitted to attend classes after the last date of payment of fee. In case of fee default, contact the school office for further details.

Requests to waive off late Fee will not be entertained. Fee once paid will not be refunded/adjusted under other heads under any circumstances.

PROMOTION CRITERIA Class IX

- In order to be declared as having passed the examination, the student has to secure 33% marks out of 20 marks in the internal assessments and 33% marks out of 80 marks in the Final Examination in each subject.
- 75 % Attendance is compulsory for every quarter.
- The students must pass in all the subjects to be promoted to class X.

Class XI

- In order to be declared as having passed the examination, a candidate shall obtain at least 33% marks in all the five subjects of internal examinations.
- In case of a subject involving practical work, a candidate must obtain 33% marks in theory and 33% marks in practical's separately in addition to 33% marks in aggregate in order to qualify in that subject.
- 75 % attendance is compulsory for every quarter.
- The students must pass in all the subjects to be promoted to class XII.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

1.1 CATEGORY A (MINOR BREACHES)

- 1.1.1 Late coming i.e. arriving late to school or to a class regularly.
- 1.1.2 Uniform issues i.e., wearing school uniform improperly, wearing items of non-school uniform, wearing of jewellery, etc. (Refer to Dress Code)
- 1.1.3 Leaving school books or items of personal property carelessly around the school campus.
- 1.1.4 Failure to do homework or to complete homework by the stipulated deadline.
- 1.1.5 Littering
- 1.1.6 Eating or drinking during a classroom session. This includes chewing gum, which is not allowed on the school campus.
- 1.1.7 Making excessive noise in or out of class. Running in the corridors/lawn, sitting on the parapet wall, chasing other students, wasting/throwing food,
 Bringing cell phones, cameras, pen-drives/other data storage devices, electronic games and any other kind of electronic gadgets to the classroom.
- 1.1.8 Public display of affection is deemed inappropriate on the school campus, e.g. embracing, and other forms of close physical contact.
- 1.1.9 Any other issue decided by the school authorities.
- 1.1.10 Students should not resort to any religious prayers and activities during the school hours.

1.2 CATEGORY B (SERIOUS BREACHES)

- 1.2.1 Abusive language or misbehaviour towards a member of staff or another student.
- 1.2.2 Disrespect or a show of dissent towards a member of staff.
- 1.2.3 Vandalism includes deliberate damage to school property, smart boards, washroom fixtures, writing on or marking furniture, walls, etc.
- 1.2.4 Lying to a member of staff.
- 1.2.5 Fraud, eg: a student writing an absence note, or signing a leave letter on behalf of his/her parents or guardian.
- 1.2.6 Cheating in an exam or test, stealing others' note books, text books or any other item
- 1.2.7 Borrowing from or lending money to another student.
- 1.2.8 Selling or buying goods on the school campus without authorization.
- 1.2.9 Gambling, e.g. playing cards is not permitted at school for this reason.
- 1.2.10 Truancy, e.g. being absent from school or a class without any satisfactory reason. Note Any student who is absent from school must produce a letter from their parent/guardian, or a medical certificate. Failure to do so will be considered as truancy.
- 1.2.11 Use of a cell phone in the school / driving on the school campus.
- 1.2.12 Any other issue that is decided by the school authorities.

1.3 CATEGORY C (VERY SERIOUS BREACHES)

- 1.3.1 Bringing drugs or intoxicants (i.e. alcoholic drinks) onto the school campus. This includes smoking in school.
- 1.3.2 Bringing any form of weapon to school.
- 1.3.3 Bullying or intimidating other students. Misbehaving with girls/molestation.
- 1.3.4 Cyber Bullying/hacking
- 1.3.5 Assault or threatening/violence Ex: upon another student or an employee of the school.
- 1.3.6 Theft
- 1.3.7 Possession or use of fireworks or any other kind of explosives.
- 1.3.8 Any other issue that is decided by the school authorities.

2. DISCIPLINARY MEASURES AND PENALTIES

2.1 Minor Breaches (Category A)

These breaches will all be looked into through the following system.

1st time: 1 st Blue slip 2nd time: 2 nd Blue slip

3rd time: 3 rd Blue slip along with 1st pink slip

Parents will be called for a counselling session and appropriate disciplinary action will be initiated.

Three Pink slips will lead to suspension from the school for a minimum period of two weeks.

Issue of Blue slips, pink slips and suspension are recorded in the personal file of the respective student and will be reflected in the coscholastic grades.

Other forms of alternatives for such breaches (e.g. clearing litter, or after School detention) may also be imposed. Students who repeatedly default will be liable to have their parents or guardian called to the school for consultation and counselling.

2.2 Serious Breaches (Category B)

Usually students who commit misdeeds of this category will receive detention. Special detention, that is detention on a Saturday afternoon, may be given if the breach is considered to be of a more serious nature.

During detention offenders will be expected to carry out some form of community service (e.g. litter collection, gum removal from furniture, arranging chairs or desks in the hall, etc.) for a minimum of two hours

Students who are repeatedly placed on detention (i.e. three or more times during a school term, or a three-month period) will have their parents called for consultation, and may be liable to additional disciplinary action.

2.3 Very Serious Breaches (Category C)

Students found guilty of any breaches in this category will immediately have their parents or guardian called. Suspension or, in the most serious cases, withdrawal/expulsion from the school may be imposed.

3. PROBATION

A student with a continuous record of disciplinary concerns, or one who has committed a very serious breach and returns to the school following a period of suspension, may be placed on probation for a certain period. During the period of probation, a student is required to maintain an exemplary record of behaviour.

Any additional serious breaches or misdemeanours committed during the period of probation can result in a student being recommended for expulsion.

4. DETENTION SYSTEM

A teacher who puts a student in detention will complete a disciplinary procedure Form for the student, a copy of which is given to the Vice Principal. The form must be taken by the student to have it signed by their class teacher and parent/guardian beforeit is returned to the VP's office.

Detentions are served on Monday through Friday from 3 00 PM-4-30 PM under the supervision of a duty teacher. Activities such as litter collection, removing grass or vegetation, or arranging chairs in the hall for school assembly, are done during the detention period.

Upon completing the detention, the names of wrongdoers and other relevant details are recorded in the detention book kept in the VP's office.

Students who frequently get into detention (i.e. three or more times during a term or a three-month period) will be interviewed by the Disciplinary Committee and will have their parents called.

A special detention may be given for breaches in Category B considered to be of a more serious nature. This involves the student spending time in the school on a Saturday afternoon or school holiday in order to serve the detention.

5. SPECIAL REPORT

This is a procedure reserved for students who have a record of disciplinary concerns, and may be given in order to monitor the student's behaviour and academic work on a daily basis.

Students placed on special report must go every day to the Vice Principal to collect a Student Behaviour Report Form. This is given to the class and subject teacher for every period of the day for comment by the teacher regarding their behaviour and schoolwork. At the end of the school day the form is returned to the VP in order to monitor the student's performance.

Usually a student will be on special report for a week, but the period may be extended if the student is judged to have made no improvement

6. DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

The Disciplinary Committee includes the Vice Principal and other senior members of staff.

The Committee meets every two weeks to review all aspects of student discipline and report/make recommendations concerning general discipline and other disciplinary cases of individual students, to the Principal.

7. DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES

In cases of serious indiscipline by students (i.e. usually those in Category - C), an inquiry will be held by members of the Disciplinary Committee in which the student or students allegedly guilty of a misconduct, together with witnesses, will be interviewed, and written statements, together with any physical evidence, obtained for the purposes of the investigation.

Depending on the nature of the alleged breach, and the evidence obtained, the parents or guardian will be contacted, and the student may be suspended while the enquiry continues.

Once statements and any other relevant information have been obtained, a report will be prepared and this, together with recommendations from the Disciplinary Committee is submitted to the Principal for evaluation.

If a student is proven guilty of a serious breach, the parents or guardian of the student will be called for consultations concerning what disciplinary action shall be taken, and the corrective measures to be imposed upon the student.

8. STUDENTS GOING OUT OF CAMPUS

Students are not permitted to leave the campus once they have arrived at school unless they have a verifiable reason. This should be either through a letter from a parent/guardian, a medical/dental appointment card, or their visit to school. Once permission has been given, a gate pass will be issued which the student must show to the gate guard in order to leave the school. Students should not leave the school campus once inside the school.

It is a serious breach to leave the school campus without authorization, and any student who does so will be considered to have committed truancy-See Category – B Truancy breaches.

9. STUDENTS DRIVING TO SCHOOL

Students who drive themselves to school and park their vehicle on the school campus must first obtain permission from the authorities. This is only granted to students who provide a valid driving licence and submit a letter from their parent or guardian authorizing them to drive to school. Parents are solely responsible for their children driving to and from school. The necessary safety gear should be worn by the students.

10. CBSE urges schools to ensure that physical fitness should be given top priority. Accordingly, HPSR has scheduled a compulsory games period in the time table on a daily basis. Students are advised to complete their assignments during the class hours only and not to miss an hour of games time. Exemption from sports will be given only for medical reasons with prior permission. Students who do not participate in games will be involved in community service.

11. INTER CLASS SHUFFLING OF STUDENTS

Students can be shifted from one section to another due to strength disparity, second language adjustments, behavioural or academic concerns. The school reserves every right to change the section of the students at any point of time without any intimation.

GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS

- >> Attend all classes daily and be on time.
- >> Come prepared to the class with appropriate materials.
- >> School diary should be brought to school every day including examination days.
- >> Students should read the diary and abide by the rules and regulations mentioned in the diary.
- >> Students should also make use of their diaries.
- All textbooks should be covered with brown paper/talc sheet and should be labelled.
- All the pages in each note book should be numbered and the index should be updated.
- → Home works and class tests should be entered in the index page along with date and page numbers.
- >> Refrain from profane or inflammatory statements.
- >> Conduct yourself in a safe and reasonable manner.
- ▶ Be well-groomed and clean.
- ★ Keep the school premises neat and clean. Writing on the walls, black boards, bathrooms, littering the campus etc., is prohibited.
- >> Students must not waste food and follow the dining etiquettes.
- >> Students should not bring or purchase any food items from outside the campus.
- ▶ Bursting of crackers, playing 'Holi' etc., are not permitted in the school premises.
- >> Students are not allowed to climb trees, stone a tree or pluck fruits or flowers from trees and plants in the school campus.
- >> Students are not allowed in the school premises on Sundays and holidays unless needed by the school.
- Quarters of resident staff members, forest area, hills and rocks in the campus are out of bounds for students.
- ▶ If a student scores less than 50% in academics, he/she will not be eligible to participate in any extra curricular activity.
- Abide by the rules and regulations set forth by the school and the teachers.
- Strict disciplinary action will be taken against students who violate the school's code of conduct.
- >> Students permitted to leave during school hours must not visit malls, theatre, or any other recreational places in the school uniform.

NORMS FOR ONLINE LEARNING (As and when required)

- >> Students should adhere to the Time Table shared by the school.
- >> They should be appropriately dressed for the classes.
- ▶ It is mandatory to attend all the classes. The portion taught will not be repeated.
- >> It is important that all the students listen attentively to the teachers.
- >> Only one student will speak at a time.
- ▶ Chatting on WhatsApp while the class is in progress is not acceptable.
- >> Using or posting any kind of indecent language is not acceptable.
- ▶ Parents are not required to be present when the class is in progress. They can just provide technical support if required.
- ▶ It must be understood that online teaching has the same importance as regular classroom teaching and so should not be taken easily.
- ▶ Instructions regarding completion and submission of assignments have to be adhered to strictly.

GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS

Parent - Teacher cooperation and communication is essential for continuous and harmonious growth of the students. Nurturing a healthy relationship between the students, staff and parents is a hallmark of a good school. We at HPS strive to provide a safe and secure environment to the students.

Few points that will help us in looking after your ward are given below. This instills right attitudes and a sense of belonging towards the school.

- Please ensure that your ward reaches the school in time and in proper turnout.
- >> Please fill and complete the first four pages of the diary within 3 days of issue of the diary.
- ▶ Please check the school diary every day and take note of the communication from the school contained therein as also the homework given.
- Please acknowledge the circulars and teacher's remarks in the space provided in the pages of the diary.
- >> Please see to it that the lessons and homework assigned for the next day are done.
- Provide your child with the resources needed to complete his/her class work.
- In case the students have to go on leave, the parents must take responsibility to ensure that their wards cover the missed syllabus and are at par with the classmates.
- Parents are expected to meet the teachers of their wards only during the visiting hours

- It is noticed that some auto drivers misbehave in the school campus and do not comply with the instructions given by the school authorities. In such a case, the particular vehicle will be barred from entering the school premises.


